What is eHealth?

"The combined use of electronic communication and information technology in the health sector".. *World Health Organisation*

- Involves the use of Modern Information and Digital Technologies
- Sometimes called 'Healthcare ICT'
- Sometimes called 'Connected Health'
- Examples include Telehealthcare, ePrescribing and Electronic Health Records and others...
- Involves automation and integration of manual processes

eHealth is Patient Centric.....

Key Points to Note!

Health should be viewed as a <u>National Infrastructural</u> <u>Investment.</u> Similar to Motorway network or utilities.

 eHealth is primarily a process-reorganisation program using IT Information Systems as enablers.
<u>Warning!</u>

OO + NT = COOOld Organisation + New Technology = Costly Old Organisation

International Experiences

Best Practise Summary...

(Based on 8 countries analysed)

- 1. Dedicated delivery entity with proper focus, governance and authority
- 2. Deploy in phases. Avoid 'big bang' approach.
- 3. Use interoperability standards
- 4. Strong stakeholder and clinical engagement from the outset.
- 5. National Health Identifier is crucial.
- 6. Strong branding and pubic awareness
- 7. Skills shortages need to be addressed at all educational levels
